# **Building Character**



While attending the thee day football camp sponsored by the Anthony Muñoz foundation, the Impact for Eternity campers participated in football training, chapel services, small group discussions and the challenge course.

While at the low course, the final teambuilding activity of our nearly three hour session was called Bullring Bonanza. In this activity each team of nine campers holds a string attached to a bullring in the center. The task is to use the bullring to pick up a tennis ball off a pedestal and then carry the tennis ball to another pedestal a short distance away.

The tricky part for the Impact for Eternity campers was that we had three teams carrying three dif-





ferent bull-rings and the three pedestals where they were to set down the tennis balls were only a few



feet apart. This made the small group activity into a large group activity.

For me, it was exciting to see how these urban youth, who typically are known for being independent and uncooperative, work together and accomplish the mission.

Throughout the camp, coaches and chaperones reinforced lessons to help the campers learn and grow in positive character qualities. On the final night of camp, NFL Hall of Famer, Anthony Muñoz shared his testimony with the boys and chal-



lenged them to become men of God who are champions of character in their homes and community.
