The Gospel Portrayed (by Debbie)

In my final weeks of serving at the challenge course, I had several highlights. I'd like to share one of them with you through the eyes of our X-Project Challenge Course Intern, Josiah. This was part of his blog about the X-Project students' experience at the challenge course upon their arrival for the summer.

There is something magical about being physically involved and challenged. At one point, the interns were ushered into the forest and presented with a 12 foot wall. The goal was simple: Get everyone up and over the wall. We had only known each other for less than 24 hours, but now we had to come together as a team.

Everyone being at different levels athletically meant that we had to plan who would be left to scale the wall all alone at the end, with only



hands reaching down from the top to assist in the climb. After our initial planning phase, we began lifting people up and over. It got more and more difficult as time went on, and we ended with just one person left at the bottom of the wall. But our planning did not help us much.

The problem was that even with a running start and a good jump, the last one on the ground,

Lindsey, was unable to reach our hands and be pulled to the top.

Had we labored all that time for nothing? No. We were determined to make it work. So one of the guys who had already made it over, Matt, climbed halfway down. Hanging on the to the top of the wall, with help from the others that had made it over, Matt became the bridge that Lindsey could climb over to reach the top. The impossible became possible!

At our debrief time after the wall, we gathered in an excited circle. We felt that we had really conquered a difficult obstacle. Even those who had considered not participating had made it over.

But here's the thing that really made this event so impactful: Lindsey, who had just used Matt to climb to the top, explained what that moment meant to her. Even using all her strength, she could never make it to the top. She could try over and over, but each attempt led to failure. To her, Matt allowing himself to be the bridge so she could reach the top was a powerful representation of the Gospel. In fact, every single one of us were hit with this image of what Jesus did--He bridged the gap between us and God, earth and heaven.

And therein lies the beauty of the challenge course: the truths of life are often mirrored in these courses. The physicality of the challenges manifest dynamic metaphors that go right to the heart. We already knew what Jesus had done, but that day we felt the power of His sacrifice.

In my fourteen years of leading the challenge course, I never had a group talk so openly about the comparison between their wall experience and the Gospel. It was truly a blessing! This is why I have loved serving in this ministry for so many years!



Passing the Baton

Ed and I have officially passed off our responsibilities with Athletes in Action to other people.

For me, I was pleased that God completed Skylar's support team and he was able to report at AIA three days before my last day.
